POSTER INSTRUCTIONS

The poster session is a highlight of this conference series. It has proven to be an effective venue for informal in-depth discussion and collaboration building as well as an important networking opportunity for all participants. Judging and selection of Pre – and Post-Doctoral Student Awardees will be made during this session. Papers on any aspect of neuroscience, toxicology or children’s environmental health are invited and welcome!

Note: The General Poster Session traditionally is scheduled as an evening session because it is conducive to discussion and getting acquainted in a less formal atmosphere without time constraints.

The Poster Session has been scheduled for Monday, June 7, 2010 from 7:00 until 9:30 PM. Papers will be grouped by topic and scheduled by title and authors in the Final Program. You will be assigned a number for the exact location of your poster. The author giving a poster presentation must be registered for the Conference.

DISPLAYS: Each presentation is assigned a 4’high by 6’wide corkboard that includes 2.2 square meters on which to display data. Please identify your poster with a title and the names of the investigators in 1” lettering at the top of the display. It is very helpful to post a copy of your abstract.

Presenters should provide their own push pins (5/8” long) for attaching posters to the display unit. The poster boards will be available to set up your display by 12:00 PM on Sunday, June 6, 2010. **Posters should be set up by Sunday evening to be available for viewing as long as possible.**

Presenters should try to attend their posters between 7:00 - 9:00 PM. If you leave your poster, please post a note indicating when you will return.

Winners of the Student Awards should stand by their poster with their Advisor following the Award Ceremony for pictures.
